Who we are

Your Park Bristol & Bath is a small but ambitious charity dedicated to making parks inclusive, vibrant and full of life. We believe green spaces should be for everyone – and that even the smallest patch of nature can have a big impact.

To connect communities with their local parks, boost wellbeing and protect nature. We work with residents, councils and businesses to create green spaces that are welcoming, wild and wonderful.

Our impact in numbers

Five years ago, the green space outside Bristol Cathedral was little more than patchy amenity grass. Fast forward to 2025, and College Green is alive with the hum of bees, the flutter of butterflies and a dazzling mix of wildflowers. Thanks to your continued support, this once-ordinary lawn has become an extraordinary haven for wildlife in the very heart of the city.

To mark five years of partnership, we commissioned an independent ecological survey to understand the real impact of the wildflower meadow we've nurtured together. The results are in – and they're brilliant.

From dull grass to dazzling diversity

Our meadow now hosts over 90 different species of plants – more than ten times the diversity found in similar grass nearby. From ox-eye daisies and wild carrot to meadow vetchling and yellow rattle, the area is now bursting with native blooms that change with the seasons and provide continuous colour, texture and life.

Of the 110 plant species introduced over the years, 56 were recorded this summer. That's a strong success rate in urban ecology, particularly given some species were never likely to thrive in this soil or setting. We've learned what works – and what doesn't – and that learning is now shaping how we approach urban meadow creation across the region.

Insects love it here: 72 species spotted

Despite its small size and location surrounded by roads and buildings, College Green now supports:

- 23 species of bee, including leafcutter, mason, mining and furrow bees – many in exceptional numbers
- 24 species of flies, including hoverflies whose larvae rely on local ant nests and root aphids
- Butterflies, moths, beetles and bugs, including several species rarely seen in central Bristol
- Insects that now complete their entire life cycles on the site not just visitors, but residents

The mix of native flowers, varied planting and seasonal management is delivering a thriving pollinator habitat, right where it's most needed.
